July 7, 2020

The Historic Zoning Commission met in regular session, on July 7, 2020 with the meeting being called to order at 7:00 pm at the Town Hall building, 330 Colwyn, Cumberland Gap, TN.

Members present included Kathy Maxwell, Tammy Debrot, Steve Moore, John Ravnum, Doug Fitts, and Jerry Hopson. Cindy Evans was absent.

There was a motion by Jerry Hopson to approve the March minutes and seconded by Steve Moore. All approved.

The topic of 601 Pennlyn Street was discussed. Mr. Estep informed the council at the town meeting that Mr. Clouse was going to sue the city. There was no further information.

Tony Maxwell shared the theme of the Cross Sector Impact Grant that was awarded to the town. This will bring signage, and a self guided tour that will lead people through the city. Zach Green talked about the educational element that the grant will bring to the town and its visitors. Students of all ages will engage in various ways.

Caroline Hatfield, the sculptor talked about materials that she would be using to complete the art for the grant. Tammy Debrot spoke about recruiting the citizens of the town in sharing relevant narratives of life in the Gap. Tony Maxwell said that this grant will be the touch stone for future grant efforts.

Kathy Maxwell had some safety concerns. The artist assured us that the sculptures will be very close to the ground, and the sites will be open. Metal will use beveled edges.

Zach Green spoke of the accessibility of the resource information that the grant is going to provide. Moving tours will also be used, and there will be an effort to bring people together from various walks of life.

There were no citizens' comments.

The next meeting is August 4, 2020.
