He further reported that the town has signed a contract with East Tennessee Development District for a city planner. Starting next month, Harold Edwards will be attending the Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals meetings.

<u>Historical – The Historic Zoning Commission scheduled for September 12, 2023 has</u> been cancelled. The date for the next Historic Zoning Commission meeting is October 3, 2023.

<u>Streets</u> – The street paving and striping has been completed.

There was considerable discussion regarding the flooding in town over weekend. One of the board members felt the new paving was the cause of the water entering a house on Pennlyn Street. He felt that the town needs to prioritize the issue. Mayor Pucciarelli responded that he was aware of the situation and has been researching ways to fix the problem.

<u>Street Lights</u>- Once a street light goes out, Powell Valley Electric will no longer be repairing the lights but replacing them with new LED ones instead. Since the LED lights are designed to shine on the street only and illuminates a broader area, his goal is to reduce the number of the lights in town (currently there is 76 street lights in town).

There have been complaints that the new LED lights were too bright. Mayor Pucciarelli explained there is a smaller LED light but the coverage is much smaller and wouldn't reduce the total number of lights in town.

The design of the lights was questioned. Mayor Pucciarelli replied that Powell Valley Electric only had two LED lights and both have the same design. It was stated that the town should have the option to choose and the lights should have a historic look. One of the board members reported that she would contact the historic town, she recently drove through, to ask where they purchased the historic lights they had.

A plan to replace/reduce lighting will be discussed further at the next agenda meeting.

<u>Parks and Recreation-</u>BlueCross Healthy Place Grant Program- Each year, starting August  $1 - 31^{st}$ , proposals are accepted to create healthy places in communities. Mayor Pucciarelli explained that by the time this grant was brought to the town's attention, we felt there wasn't enough time to apply. Mayor Pucciarelli wanted to let the board be aware of the grant and to be thinking about a project for next year.

Tourism/Events-Upcoming Events include:

White Lighting Trail Festival- September 16, 2023; Hank Fest- September 23, 2023; Harvest Moon- September 30, 2023; Mountain Fiesta- September 28- 30, 2023.

Water-The water loss for the month of August was 17%.

<u>Utility Training</u>- The required 12 hours of utility training is due to be completed by November 2023.

<u>Sewer</u> – There was nothing to report.

<u>OSHA Safety Director-</u> A representative from Tennessee OSHA will be here on September 12, 2023 for an inspection.

Mayor Pucciarelli called for Old Business:

<u>TN Downtown Grant Update- Guardians of the Gap-</u> The contract has been signed and is effective as of October 1, 2023.

Colloredo and Associates (the marketing firm that Guardians are engaging to develop our tourism logo, brand, visitor map, signage, etc.) will be visiting the Gap on Tuesday September 26, 2023.

Updates will be given at the monthly Board of Mayor and Alderman meetings.

<u>On Bike Share System-</u> The Olde Mill B & B has agreed to pay for five (5) bicycles and one rack for the new bike share program. In exchange they ask to be able to advertise their business on the bikes and/or rack and the town to pay the yearly fee of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). The new bikes/racks have an electronic lock/unlock mechanism and each bike includes GPS tracking.

John Douglas made a motion approving the yearly fee, with a second by Teresa Fuson. Mayor Pucciarelli called for a roll call vote. Board members voted as follows: John Douglas- yes; Teresa Fuson- yes; Camille Hall- yes; Bill Linn- yes; John Ravnum- yes; Morgan Wheeler- yes

The National Park will be enlisting community input for the implementation of a Five Year (5 year) Strategic Plan and the update to the Long-Range Interpretive Plan.

Superintendent Baldwin also reported that funding has been awarded to repair the Gap Creek Walking Bridge. The project will begin in Spring 2024.
