# **Sewer**

Jesse Thompson asked that the board consider signing an extended contract with his company Wastewater Specialist (instead of from year to year). Chuck Coffey made a motion to approve a 5 year contract, with a second by Susan Bain. Mayor McGaffee called for a roll call vote. Board members voted as follows: Susan Bain-yes; Chuck Coffey-yes; Teresa Fuson- yes; Jerry Hopson -yes; John Ravnum-yes; Phillip Waller-yes.

There has been a tremendous amount of excess water coming into the wastewater treatment plant. The town purchased a flow meter to determine where it was coming

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from. It was determined that the excessive flow was coming from the line belonging to Lincoln Memorial University. In December they were billed for the excess amount, which totaled around \$5,000 more than their normal bill. LMU has requested an adjustment to the bill.

The board discussed several options:

- charge \$1,000 extra for the first month, then increase it a little each month for a set number of months (until leak is fixed)
- Charge \$1,000 extra each month until leak is fixed. If not fixed in set number of months increase the amount.

Jim Estep explained that Gary Burchett has requested to meet with him later this week. He isn't sure what the meeting is about, but assumes it is concerning this matter. If not then Mr. Estep says he will bring up the issue during the meeting.

Phillip Waller made a motion to charge them \$1,000 extra on current bill and review further next month pending the attorney's meeting with Gary Burchett. Mayor McGaffee called for a roll call vote. Board members voted as follows: Susan Bain-yes; Chuck Coffey-yes; Teresa Fuson-yes; Jerry Hopson-yes; John Ravnum-yes; Phillip Waller-yes.

The Koi fish at the WWTP have overpopulated and need to be relocated. Several months ago someone contacted the town about buying some of them.

Susan Bain made a motion to declare the Koi fish surplus and to sell them for \$10 apiece, with a second by Teresa Fuson. Mayor McGaffee called for a roll call vote. Board members voted as follows: Susan Bain-yes; Chuck Coffey-yes; Teresa Fuson-yes; Jerry Hopson-yes; John Ravnum-yes; Phillip Waller-yes.

## **Fire Department**

Training is the department's main priority at this time. Currently four volunteer firefighters are enrolled in training with Tazewell and New Tazewell.

Phillp Waller donated a tank for one of the vehicles moving it from being a crash vehicle to being a brush truck. It concedes with the needs of our response area and puts the department in a new bracket with future grants, explained fire chief, Brandon Wilkinson.

Representatives with East Tennessee Development District and Vaughn and Melton met with the town last month. They discussed ways to improve the next CDBG application, which included lowering the project cost. The application deadline is February 28, 2016.

## **Citizens Comments**

The board discussed complaints made against the Gap Tap. Complaints include patrons trespassing on private property, public urinating, loud noise, and excessive traffic.

The trespassing complaints took place outside the establishment, so there forth, they are not the responsibility of the owner but the town's. Mayor McGaffee reported they he is looking into hiring another police officer. The officer that was recently hired did not work out due to his conflicting schedule.

One resident said he looked into the parking regulations set forth in the historic district. Even though the business is not in the historic district, the parking regulations should still apply within the district. The regulations would not affect the business only the individuals parking. The attorney will look into that aspect further.

Traffic is a big issue. When the patron's leave the establishment there is an influx in traffic on that street. Mayor McGaffee explained that is not the responsibility of the establishment.

The neighbor's explained that they have witnessed and documented several incidents. The establishment is causing a nuisance, one neighbor reported.

According to Mayor McGaffee the town has two options: (1) hire a police officer; (2) the town council can vote beer completely out.

The neighbor's reported they have trouble sleeping due to the excessive noise outside their windows. It was suggested that the owner, Chris Anderson, not let his patrons loiter outside. If they go outside to smoke make then go back in afterwards. Mayor McGaffee commented that Mr. Anderson cannot make them stay inside.

Mr. Anderson commented that if someone breaks the law then he calls the cops. He urged the residents to do so also. Several of the resident's replied that they have, but by the time the sheriff's department arrive the offenders are already gone. Mr. Anderson further explained that all he can do is ask them to leave and call 911. He spoke about several incidents where he has done just that.

The issue will be discussed further during the beer board meeting.
