# TOWN OF CUMBERLAND GAP BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMAN MARCH 7, 2016 PAGE 1 OF 4

The Board of Mayor and Alderman met in regular session on March 7, 2016 with Mayor McGaffee calling the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall building, 330 Colwyn, Cumberland Gap, TN. After the Pledge to the Flag, Mayor McGaffee called for a roll call of the Board Members. Board Members answered as follows: Susan Bain-here; Chuck Coffey- here; Teresa Fuson- absent; Jerry Hopson -here; John Ravnum-here; Phillip Waller-here.

Mayor McGaffee called for approval of the minutes. Susan Bain made a motion to the approve minutes, with a second by Chuck Coffey. Mayor McGaffee called for a roll call vote. Board members voted as follows: Susan Bain-yes; Chuck Coffey-yes; Teresa Fuson- absent; Jerry Hopson -yes; John Ravnum-yes; Phillip Waller-yes.

Mayor McGaffee next called for the Financial Report. Town Recorder, Linda Moyers, reported the balances of all the accounts. Mayor McGaffee called for a motion to approve the Financial Report. Chuck Coffey made a motion to approve the financial report, with a second by Susan Bain. Mayor McGaffee called for a roll call vote. Board members voted as follows: Susan Bain-yes; Chuck Coffey-yes; Teresa Fuson- absent; Jerry Hopson -yes; John Ravnum-yes; Phillip Waller-yes.

Mayor McGaffee directed the meeting to approval of the bills. Jerry Hopson made a motion to pay the bills, with a second by Susan Bain. Mayor McGaffee called for a roll call vote. Board members voted as follows: Susan Bain-yes; Chuck Coffey-yes; Teresa Fuson- absent; Jerry Hopson -yes; John Ravnum-yes; Phillip Waller-yes.

Before the committee reports, Richard Hill gave the audit report for FY 2015. The town received a clean or unmodified audit opinion, which means the financial statements were presented fairly in all material respects.

During FY 2015, the town had two major funds- General Fund and Drug Fund. Total assets for both funds was \$219,663. In the General Fund there was an excess of revenue and other financing sources over expenditures in the amount of \$43,361. The fund balance for the General Fund at the end of the year is \$161,319. The Drug Fund had no revenue and \$16 in expenses. The fund balance for the Drug Fund at the end of the year is \$2,431.

Mr. Hill spoke concerning the new law that is now into effect (went into effect for FY 2016) that requires water and sewer activities be recorded into a separate accounting fund (instead of being a part of the general fund). Had there been a separate fund accounting for FY 2015 the water & sewer activities would have had a deficiency of revenue over expenditures in the amount of \$73,241. This report includes depreciation (\$93,199), which in the past the town has not been required to fund. Under the new law, depreciation must funded. The town has since raised water and sewer rates in order to fund depreciation.

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If there is a loss in water and sewer activities for two consecutive years, the state will review expenses and rates. This fiscal year will not be counted, because the activities was not recorded in a separate accounting fund. Beginning this current fiscal year, FY 2016, the water and sewer activities are in a separate fund.

Although the town is not required to put the depreciation funds into a savings account, the money cannot be used for repairs and maintenance of existing equipment (or water/sewer lines) and should only be used for purchasing capital equipment. Capital equipment is defined as equipment that will last more than one year and goes over the capitalization threshold set forth by the town.

There was only one finding, which is the same as previous years, segregation of duties. Due to limited number of personnel a lack of segregation of duties exists. The recorder mentioned the new law that requires an internal control policy be in place as of June 30, 2016. Mr. Hill stated that the town's migrating control may be the board's involvement, for instance they are involved in paying the bills.

Mr. Hill explained the base fee for the FY 2016 audit will be \$9,450, an increase of \$275 from the prior year fee (which was not increased from the fee for the year prior to that). Because the Town will be required to present the water and sewer activities in a separate fund for the first time, they will incur some time to modify the financial statements for these changes. They would bill this only for the time it takes, and should not be no more than \$750. That is a one-time charge to get everything changed over for the new format.

Jerry Hopson made a motion to contract with Mitchell Emert and Hill for FY2016, with a second by Chuck Coffey. Mayor McGaffee called for a roll call vote. Board members voted as follows: Susan Bain-yes; Chuck Coffey-yes; Teresa Fuson- absent; Jerry Hopson -yes; John Ravnum-yes; Phillip Waller-yes.

The board members were given a copy of the Profit & Loss Budget vs Actual for the General Fund & Water and Wastewater Fund.

Preparations are being made for the FY2017 budget. Proposals will be given to the board and will be reviewed at the next planning meeting. The board was given information for a possible property tax increase.

New Do Probes (dissolved oxygen probes) are needed at the sewer plant. By purchasing new ones the town can save \$1,000 per month on the electric bill.
